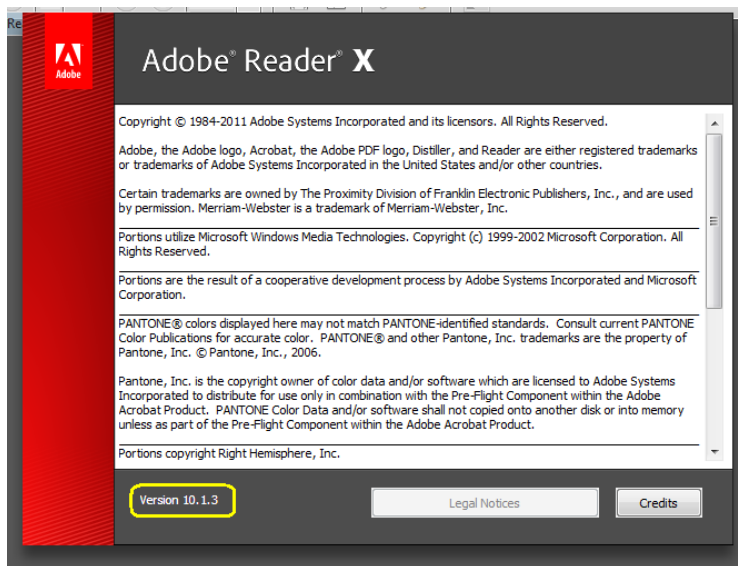

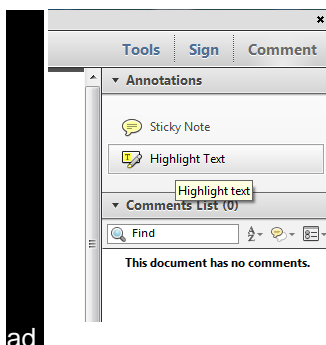
How to comment a PDF file

1. Verify to use Adobe Reader in a version higher than 10.x.x.
 - Start Adobe Reader
 - Click *Help* -> *About Adobe Reader...*

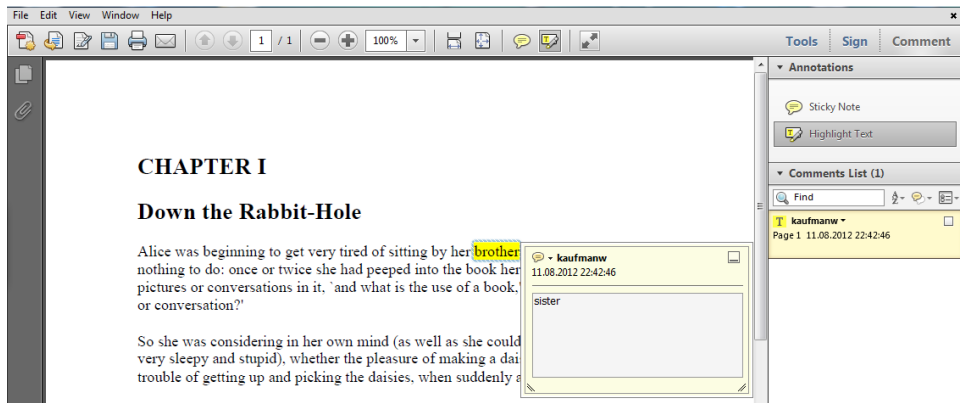


If the version is less than 10.x.x please upgrade to the current version (<http://get.adobe.com/reader/>).

2. Mark text changes in the document
 - Display Comments Panel by clicking *Comment* in tool bar



- Highlight the text you want to change
- Right-click the selected text and choose *Open Pop-Up Note* from context menu
- Enter your text into the text area of the Pop-Up



3. Mark text inserts

- Highlight the words to the left and to the right of your text to be inserted
- Enter your text into the text area of the Pop-Up panel

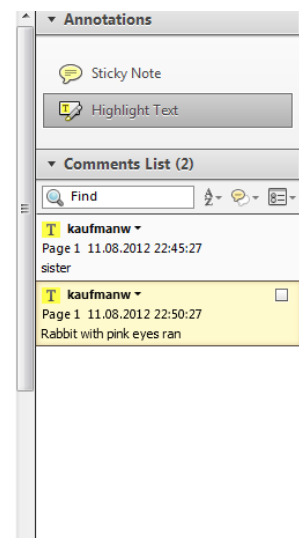

- Enter 'delete this' in the text area of the Pop-Up panel




